Meeting Minutes: February 10, 2020

Sue Deyo called the meeting to order at 7:00pm

Welcome/Devotion/Prayer: Sue announced that we had one new visitor. She gave the devotion and Elaine Wilkerson offered the prayer.

Ratification of January Minutes: Motion by Lori Frederick, seconded by Anne Hines, and passed unanimously to approve the January 2020 minutes.

- **Bylaw Revision:** Marsa Detscher reviewed all the proposed changes. She explained that the changes were "clean up" revisions, to reflect how the guild actually operates.

 pillowcase kits which she will bring to the next meeting. Sue asked that members consider picking up
 some packages to sew at home and return to the next meeting.

Tips & Pieces - Barbara Wagner: Barbara demonstrated how you must be very careful when using templates. Sometimes the measurements are off a fraction. But when you add a fraction to every block across a quilt, it adds up to serious differences. While she did not make any recommendations, Barb cautioned the guild members to measure and know your rulers.
